## CLASS -X (FAQ)

### Class X: How to apply for duplicate certificates and mark sheets?

#### Answer:

A candidate may obtain duplicate/triplicate certificate/ Grade-sheet cum Certificate of Performance on submission of the following in the event of loss/theft/mutilation of the original certificate: -

- i) Submission of an application on prescribed form
- ii) Payment of the prescribed fee
- iii) Publication of the notification of the loss/theft/mutilation in some leading newspaper of national level in Hindi or English and submission of full page of said press clipping in original.

### Class X: How to request for Correction in Date of Birth?

#### Answer:

The application for correction in date of birth duly forwarded by the Head of school along with documents mentioned in byelaws 69.2(iii) shall be entertained by the Board only within one year of the date of declaration of result. No correction whatsoever shall be made on application submitted after the said period of one year.

### Class X: How to apply for Change in name?

#### Answer:

Applications regarding changes in name or surname of candidates may be considered, provided the changes have been admitted by the Court of law and notified in the Government Gazette before the publication of the result of the candidate.

## Class X: How to apply for correction in spelling on name/surname?

### Answer:

Correction in name to the extent of correction in spelling errors, factual typographical errors in the Candidate's name / Surname, Father's name / Mother's name or Guardian's name to make it consistent with what is given in the school record or list of candidates (LOC) submitted by the school may be made.

Application for correction in name of Candidate/Father's/Mother's/ Guardian's name will be considered only within one year of the date of declaration of result provided the application of the candidate is forwarded by the Head of Institution with the following attested documents:

I. True Copy of Admission form(s) filled in by the parents at the time of admission duly attested by the Head of the concerned institution

II. True Copy of the School Leaving Certificate of the previous school submitted by the parents of the candidate at the time of admission duly attested by the Head of the concerned institution. iii. True copy of the portion of the page of admission and withdrawal register of the school where the entry has been made in respect of the candidate, duly attested by the Head of the concerned institution

## Class X: Is studying the NCERT textbook enough to score well in boards?

### Complete Question:

Is studying the NCERT textbook enough to score well in boards? Are there any other reference books one can use, to solve additional practice problems?

### Answer:

Textbooks published by NCERT are the only textbooks prescribed for classes IX & X and only text books recommended by NCERT for classes XI & XII by the Board, and these are sufficient. However, in order to have understanding of concepts covered under different sub-topics, if needed, one may refer to some other standard textbooks.

## Class X: What is the cut-off percentage of attendance?

### Answer:

A candidate has to complete the required percentage of attendance (75%) for Class IX, X, XI, XII as the case may be, as per examination Bye laws of the Board to make him/her eligible for the examinations conducted by the Board/School. Candidate taking up a subject(s) involving practical examination are also required to have put in at least 75% of the total attendance for practical work in the subject in the laboratory.

Students participating in Sports at National level organized by recognized Federations/CBSE/SGFI have to complete atleast 60% of attendance in respect of, the Classes held counted from the day of commencing teaching Classes IX/X/XI/XII, as the case may be. Candidates taking up a subject(s) involving practical shall be required to have put in at least 60% of the total attendance for practical work in the subject in the laboratory.

The candidates who had failed in the same examination in the preceding year and also who rejoin Classes IX/X/XI/XII shall be required to put in 75% of attendance calculated on the possible attendance from the 1<sup>st</sup> of the month following the publication of the results of that examination by the School/Board upto the 1<sup>st</sup> of the month preceding the month in which the examination of the School/Board commences.

Students participating in Sports at National level organized by recognized Federations/CBSE/SGFI who had failed in the same examination in the preceding year and rejoin Classes IX/X/XI/XII shall be required to put in 60% of attendance in respect of calculated on the possible attendance from the 1<sup>st</sup> month following the publication of the results of that examination by the School/Board upto the 1<sup>st</sup> of the month preceding the month in which the examination of the school/Board commences.

In the cases of migration from other institutions, attendance at the institution/School recognized by the Education Department of the State/Union Territory from which the candidate migrates will be taken into account in calculating the required percentage of attendance.

**Class X: Will the 'Grade Sheet Cum Certificate of Performance' be same for Upgrading of Performance and main exam?**

### Answer:

No, Candidates who appear for Upgrading of Performance are issued only Statement of Subject wise Performance reflecting the grades obtained in the said examination.

**Class X: What is the eligibility criteria to admission in Class X?**

### Answer:

As the syllabus prescribed at Secondary level is of two years integrated course, no admission shall be taken in Class X directly. Provided further that admission to Class X in a school shall be open only to such a student who:

- (a) has completed a regular course of study for class IX, and
- (b) has passed class IX examination from an institution affiliated to this Board.
- (c) A student who has completed a regular course of study for Class IX and has passed Class IX examination from an institution recognised by/affiliated to any recognised Board in India, other than this Board, can be admitted to a school only on the transfer of the parent(s) or shifting of their families from one place to another, after procuring from the students the mark sheet and the Transfer Certificate duly countersigned by the Educational Authorities of the Board concerned. In case of such admissions the schools would obtain post facto approval of the Board within one month of admission of the student.

### **Class X: How to know percentage marks instead of grades in Class X?**

#### **Complete Question:**

I am a class X student. The Board has introduced grading system. Will it also be possible to know percentage marks of any student?

### Answer:

No. The statement of performance of every student will show only grades.

### **Class X: Will school exams not result in lowering of academic achievements?**

#### **Complete Question:**

If Board examinations are made optional, there will be no pressure on students due to external examinations. Will it not result in lowering of their academic achievements?

### Answer:

There will still be examination based on Board's syllabus. The pattern and standard of question paper will also be decided by the Board. This will take care of levels of learning.

There are other better methods of motivating and inspiring students to achieve more than pressure due to Board examination.

### **Class X: What are the rules & eligibility for Improvement of Performance exam in Class X?**

#### **Answer:**

(i) A candidate who has passed Secondary School Examination of the Board may appear at the examination for Improvement of performance in one or more subjects in the main examination in succeeding year only, provided he/she has not pursued higher studies in the mean time. He/ she shall appear as a private candidate. Those reappearing in the whole examination, may appear as regular school candidates also.

(ii) A candidate appearing for improvement in subject(s) involving practical shall appear only in theory and previous practical marks shall be carried forward and accounted for.

(iii) Candidates who appear for improvement of performance will be issued only Statement of Marks reflecting the marks of the main examination as well as those of the improvement examination.

(iv) A candidate appearing for improvement of performance in one or more subjects can not appear for additional subject simultaneously.
